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## 1.0 INSTRUCTION

## 1.1 Safety Instructions

Read all of the instructions before operating the set. Keep these instructions well for later use.

- Only use attachments/accessories specified or provided by the manufacturer (such as the exclusive supply adapter, battery etc.).
- Please refer to the information on the exterior back enclosure for electrical and safety information before installing or operating the apparatus.
- To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this apparatus to rain or moisture.
- The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspaper, table-cloths, curtains, etc.
- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.
- The mark indicates a risk of electric shock. The external wires must be installed by an instructed person or ready-made leads or cords must be used.

## 1.4 Equipment set-up

Install the display on a solid horizontal surface such as a table or desk. For ventilation, leave a space of at least 10 cm free all around the set. To prevent any fault and unsafe situations, please do not place any objects on top of the set. This apparatus can be used in tropical and/or moderate climates.

#### Stand assembly instruction

Fig. 1b + 1c

- Carefully place the TV with its front side facing down on a cushioned flat surface in order to protect the TV and the TV screen from damage.
- 2. Take out the 2x feet and assemble them to the TV.
- 3. Fasten the feet to the bottom of the TV using the 4 x ST3 x 12mm screws.

This user manual provides complete instructions for installing and using this TV. The symbols serve as follows.

## 2.6 Installing the batteries

Fig. 5

Place 2x AAA batteries in the battery compartment of the remote control. Make sure to match the polarity markings inside the compartment.



#### NOTE:

Pictures are only for reference. Actual items may differ.

- Slide the cover horizontally.
- Put 2x AAA batteries in the compartment and make sure the polarity is correct.
- Slide horizontally to close the cover.

#### Precautions for using the battery

Improper using of the battery will cause leakage. Carefully follow these instructions.

- Please note the batteries' polarity to avoid short circuit.
- When the battery's voltage is insufficient which affect the use range, you should replace it with a new battery. Remove the batteries from the remote control unit if you do not intend to use it for a long time.
- Do not use different types of batteries (for example Manganese and Alkaline batteries) together.
- Do not put the battery into fire, and charge or decompose the battery.
- Please dispose batteries abide by relevant environmental protection regulation.

### 2.7 Using the remote control

- Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor. Items between the remote control and the remote sensor could block normal operation.
- Do not cause the remote control to vibrate violently. Also, do not splash liquid on the remote control, also do not put the remote control in a high humidity place.
- Do not place the remote control under direct sunlight which will cause deformation of the unit by heat.
- When the remote sensor is under direct sunlight or strong lighting, the remote control will not
  work. If so, please change the lighting or TV's position, or operate the remote control closer to
  the remote sensor.

## 3.0 FIRST TIME INSTALLATION

After all connections have been made properly, switch on your TV. Insert the main power plug into the wall outlet, now the red LED light should light up. Press the  $\emptyset$  button on your remote control to wake the TV up. The language and country selection will appear on the screen. Use  $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$  to select the *OSD Language* of your preference. Use  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  to select the *Country* and use  $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$  again to select the region you are using this TV. This country/region selection is an important setting, it will set the time zone and will try to sort region channels at first or in a specific order.

If all settings are made, confirm with **OK** on your remote control and follow the next steps.

On the next screen, you can select which tuner you like to use and which channels you'd like to search for. Choose *Tuner Type* and by pressing ◀ ▶ you can choose between *DTV*, *ATV* or *DTV* + *ATV* (DTV to search digital broadcasts; ATV to search analogue broadcasts). After you made your selection, press ▼ to proceed to *Digital type*. In this menu you can select which input source you would like to use:

- *DVB-S* to receive satellite broadcasts (if you are equipped with a satellite dish)
- *DVB-T* to receive terrestrial broadcasts (by using indoor or outdoor antenna)
- *DVB-C* to receive cable broadcasts. (Connection to cable outlet box)

Then the next screen appears depending from the tuner selection you choose.

## 3.1 DVB-S/S2 installation

#### Satellite Setting



Press ◀ ▶ to select the satellite your dish is aimed at. Use the ◀ ▶ ▲▼ buttons to change settings for your satellite installation for each specific satellite.

#### **Channel Search**

Press A V I be to highlight the options of choice and press OK to start the channel search.

Scan Mode Choose between Default (recommended), Blind Scan and Network and Fast

Scan

Channel Type Select Free to search Free-To-Air channels only,

Select Scramble to search Encrypted channels only, All Channels to search FTA

and Encrypted channels.

Service Type Select DTV to search Digital TV channels only, RADIO to search radio channels

only or All for a complete search.

It is recommended to use the default settings.

**NOTE:** Fast Scan option allows you to load pre-installed channel list from some

providers. This selection list appears when you have chosen Fast Scan and

confirm with **OK** button.

### 3.2 DVB-T/T2 installation

### **Terrestrial Setting**

Here you only need to press **OK** to start searching.

All settings are automatically set by country selection you made in first step.

NOTE: If you have an active antenna, please check the user manual of the antenna

for external power supply. The TV can NOT supply power used for an active

antenna.

### 3.3 DVB-C installation

#### **Cable Setting**

Press ▲▼ ◀ ▶ to highlight your settings.

Scan type You can select Network Scan, Full, or Blind Scan. (Default Network Scan for

quick search advised).

**NOTE:** Full scan will have a duration of approximately 20 minutes, depending on

your cable network.

Network ID Please enter (with  $0 \sim 9$ ) the used Network ID from your provider.

Frequency Please enter (with  $\mathbf{0} \sim \mathbf{9}$ ) the main frequency used by your provider in KHz.

Please enter (with  $\mathbf{0} \sim \mathbf{9}$ ) the used Symbol from your provider. (Ks/s)



**NOTE:** Please check the settings for your cable system used by your provider!

Press **OK** to continue and to start search process.

We hope you will enjoy it for many years.

## 4.0 ELECTRONIC PROGRAMME GUIDE (EPG)

EPG stands for Digital Electronic Programme Guide. It is supplied by the programme providers and offers information on broadcasted programmes. You can access it in digital mode by pressing EPG on the remote control. Press EPG to bring up the EPG interface. Use ▲▼ to select a programme. Use ◀ ► to select an event from one channel. Press INFO to see more details from selected event. If you like this event and want to set a reminder. Just press GREEN button and reminder is set. You can set even Timer for this event 1 x time/Daily/Weekly/Always just be repeating this button. This Timer overview is in menu to find under name *Schedule List*.

Then press the **COLOUR BUTTONS** for entering the required settings.

GREEN Set reminder or timer for event
YELLOW Previous day EPG overview
BLUE Next day EPG overview

### 5.0 MENU SETTINGS

Below items depend if they are available of select input source. Use **SOURCE** button to select other input source. The selections under this button are, Satellite, DTV, ATV, AV, HDMI 1, HDMI 2 and Media.

## 5.1 Menu control (DTV mode)

Press MENU to enter the main menu. Press ◀ ▶ to select an item. Press ▲ ▼ and OK to select the submenus. Press MENU to exit the item.

### 5.2 Picture menu

Picture Mode Select the automatic picture control mode. Available choices are Dynamic,

Standard, Mild and Personal.

Colour Temperature Select the overall colour tone of the picture. Available choices are Cool,

Normal and Warm.

Noise Reduction Eliminates noise in the picture. Available choices are Off, Low, Middle, High

and Default.

Aspect Ratio Select the aspect ratio (display proportions) according to your video signal

type or preference. Available choices are *Auto*, 4:3, 16:9, Zoom1, Zoom2 and *PointToPoint*. **Note**: Some options may not be available under some sources.

Tomeror of the Mote. Some options may not be available

HDMI mode Select one of the option. Auto, Video, or Graphic.

In the Personal mode, settings can be changed for Brightness, Contrast, Colour and Sharpness.

### 5.2.1 Contrast/Brightness/Colour Tint/Sharpness

If Picture Mode is set to Personal you are able to change the following settings

Press ▲▼ to select an option, then press ◀▶ to adjust.



Contrast Adjust the highlight intensity of the picture, but the shadow of the picture is

invariable.

Brightness Adjust the optical fiber output of the entire picture, it will effect the dark

region of the picture.

Colour Adjust the saturation of the colour based on your own preference.

Tint No function

Sharpness Adjust the peaking in the detail of the picture.

### 5.2.2 Colour Temperature

In this menu you can change the overall colour cast of the picture.

Press ▲ ▼ to select *Colour Temperature*, then press **OK** to enter a sub-menu. Press ▲ ▼ to select the

relevant picture effect (DEFAULT: Cold Normal Warm).

Cold Increase the blue tone for the white.

Normal Increase the neutral colours for the white.

Warm Increase the red colour for the white.

#### 5.2.3 Noise Reduction

In this menu you can filter out and reduce the image noise and improve picture quality. Press  $\Delta \nabla$  to select *Noise Reduction*, then press **OK** to enter a sub-menu.

Off Select to turn off video noise detection.

Low Detect and reduce low video noise.

Middle Detect and reduce moderate video noise.

High Detect and reduce enhanced video noise.

Default Set as Default.

### 5.3 Sound menu

Sound Mode Select your favourite sound mode for each input. Choices are Standard, Music,

Movie, Sports and Personal.

Enjoy Music Turns off the screen or switch to music source when it will be found on HDMI

input.

Auto Volume Adjust the volume corresponding to the input audio level. Options are On

and Off.

S/PDIF Type If you have connected S/PDIF output to digital home audio system. You can

select "Auto" to output Dolby audio\* automatically. If channel have this audio channel. Selection *PCM* is only stereo audio and *Off* is to switch off this output.

AD Switch Turn on the Audio description, you can activate the setting of AD volume.

When turn on the audio description, a narrator will describe what is happening on the screen for blind or visually impaired viewers. (Only if

available in DTV mode.)

#### 5.4 Installation

Press **MENU** to display the main menu. Press  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  to select *Auto Tuning* in the main menu. Press **OK** it access and press  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  to select the option you wish to adjust in the *Auto Tuning* menu. Press **OK** to enter and to adjust.

Below items depend if they are available of select input source. Use SOURCE to select other source.

#### 5.4.1 Auto Tuning

Press ▲ ▼ to select *Auto Tuning*, select the *Region Tune Type* and proceed with **OK**. If you use *DTV* as input source, you can switch between *DVB-T* Terrestrial and *DVB-C* Cable. If you use *Satellite* as input source, you can select the satellite your dish are pointing to and how want to search for.

### 5.4.2 Dish Setup (Satellite)

The *Dish Setup* menu allow you to set you satellite and belonging settings as DiSEqC port(s) and LNB type. Also you can select motor DiSEqC1.2 and 1.3 function. Afterwards you may start the *Auto Tuning* or *Manual Tuning* by selecting with *EPG* button the wanted transponder.

### 5.4.3 DTV Manual Tuning (in DVB-T mode only)

Search and store programmes manually. Press  $\blacktriangle \nabla$  to select *DTV Manual Tuning*. Then press **OK** to enter the sub-menu.

Press ◀ ▶ to select a *Channel No.*, and then press **OK** to start the search. The search stops when a programme is found and this programme will be stored in the current channel position. If you want to stop the search, press **MENU**.

### 5.4.4 ATV Manual Tuning

First select the source type of ATV. Then in the *Installation* menu, select *ATV Manual Tuning* and press **OK** to access. Highlight and press **▲** ▼ to select *Current CH 1* (maybe other number), *Sound System* and *Channel No.*. Then select *Search* and press **OK** to start the search. Press ▶ for the unit to search towards higher frequency. Press ◀ for the unit to search towards lower frequency. The search stops when a programme is found and this programme will be stored in the current channel position. If you want to stop the search, press **MENU**.

Current CH Set the channel number

Colour System Select the colour system (Available: AUTO, PAL, SECAM)

Sound System Select the Sound system

Fine-Tune Adjust the frequency of the channel

Search Start the channel search

### 5.4.5 Channel extra settings

Programme Edit Edit the programmes. You can press the COLOUR BUTTONS on the remote

control to skip programmes, rename and delete programmes or move programmes, and add programmes to the favourite list by pressing FAV.

**NOTE:** Some regions are using automatically channel sorting and numbering

(LCN). Which make renumbering of channels by sorting and deleting of channel list not possible. This will auto selected by country selection.



Schedule List Press ▲▼ in the Channel. Select Schedule List, then press **OK** to enter the sub-

menu. Use the COLOUR BUTTONS to modify your settings.

Signal Information Showing the information of current DTV channel. Only available with DTV

ignal.

Clinformation Enables the user to watch and change settings of CAM modules and check

values from inserted smart card.

#### 5.5 Time menu

Press MENU to display the main menu. Press ▲▼ to select *TIME* in the main menu. Press OK to do further adjustments. Press OK to return to the previous menu.

Clock The time is automatically obtained from the channel transmission and

doesn't have to be set manually. Should this function not be provided by the broadcaster, it is possible to set it by pressing **OK** and set date and time by

pressing ▲▼ ◀ ▶.

Time Zone Press ▲ ▼ to select Time Zone and confirm with OK.

On Timer This function allows to set a timer to turn ON the TV automatically. First

you need to set the repetitiveness of the timer. You can choose between: Once, Every Day, Mon-Fri, Mon-Sat, Sat-Sun, Sun, OFF (default). Then set hour,

minutes, source, channel and volume.

Off Timer This function allows to turn OFF the TV. It is also necessary to set the

repetitiveness and the time (hour/minutes). You can choose between: Once,

Every Day, Mon-Fri, Mon-Sat, Sat-Sun, Sun, OFF (default)

Sleep Timer Press ▲ ▼ to select Sleep Timer. Available Options: Off, 10 min., 20 min., 30

min., 60 min., 90min., 120 min., 180 min. and 240 min..

Auto Standby This function allows you to set the automatic shutdown of your TV. Choose

between 3H, 4H, 5H or Off to disable this function.

OSD Timer This function allows you to choose how long the info banner is displayed.

Choose between 5s, 15s or 30s.

## 5.6 Setup Menu

Language Select the Menu OSD language of your choice. The default setting is English.

Press ▲▼ to select the menu language and confirm with **OK**.

TT Language Select the TT language of your choice of character set of TeleText.

Audio Languages Press ▲▼ to select your chosen Audio Language, then press OK.

Subtitle Language Press ▲▼ to select your chosen Subtitle Language, then press OK.

Hearing Impaired Select this option to switch audio track Hearing Impaired to on. Options are

On and Off.

Subtitle Select on or off

Also you can format to FTA 32 your device.

Please, be a wear that all your data will be deleted.

Blue Screen Select this option to switch on a blue screen if there is no signal on the input.

Options are On and Off.

Soundbar Select on or off



Software Update (USB) Press **OK** and use **♦** to select *Yes* if you want to update the software or *No* 

to go back to the main menu. For more information see also chapter **6.2.4**.

HDMI Auto Switch With this option you can set CEC function ON/OFF. With the CEC function,

your other devices (if they support CEC function) that are connected to the

HDMI1 port can be operated with one remote control.

SW information SW information of TV appears in this menu

#### 5.7 Lock

Press **MENU** to display the main menu. Press ▲ ▼ to select the *Lock* menu settings. Press **OK** to do further adjustments. Press ▲ ▼ to select the options. The following options are available:

System Lock This option allows you to enable or disable the password protection. Press **OK** 

to set this function On or Off.

Set Password The default password is **0000**, to customize the password press **OK** and follow

the instruction within the menu.

Channel Lock This option allows you to prevent viewing of one or more channels. Press **OK** 

to display the channel list and select with  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  the channel you want to be locked. Press **GREEN** to lock it. Consider the same procedure to lock other

channels if needed.

Parental Guidance Press **OK** to enter and set the age for suitable programmes for children, then

press  $\blacktriangle \nabla$ .

Key Lock This option disables the TV buttons.

### **6.0 MEDIA ON USB**

## 6.1 Reminder when using the USB player

- 1. Some USB storage devices may not be compatible to operate smoothly with this TV.
- 2. Back up all of the data in the USB storage device in case data is lost due to an unexpected accident. STRONG does not assume any liability for the losses by misuse or malfunction. Data backup is consumer's responsibility.
- 3. For large file sizes, the loading speed may be slightly longer.
- 4. The recognition speed of a USB storage device may depend on each device.
- When connecting or disconnecting the USB storage device, make sure the TV is not in USB mode otherwise the USB storage device or the files stored in it may be damaged.
- Please use only a USB storage device which is formatted in FAT16, FAT32, NTFS (playback only) file system provided with the Windows operating system. In case of a storage device formatted as a different utility programme which is not supported by Windows, it may not be recognized.
- When using a USB Hard Disk Drive which is not powered independently, ensure its power does not exceed 500 mA. Otherwise the TV system will change into standby mode, and you must pull out the USB Hard Disk and restart the TV system.
- 8. An "Unsupported File" message will be displayed if the file format is unsupported or the file is corrupted.
- 9. FHD big picture needs longer time to process, which is not caused by the TV. Please be patient.
- 10. This TV may not support some multimedia files changed and upgraded as the change of the encoding format or other technical aspects advances.
- 11. Please refer to chapter **9. Appendix** for a list of supported file formats for USB playback.



#### 6.2 USB menu

Press SOURCE and select USB. You can view movie, music and photo files from your USB storage devices. Connect a USB storage device to the USB input terminal and select the types of media on the home page: Movie, Music and Photo. Press OK, the screen will show the connected USB device, press OK again to view the file folders and files. Press A  $\nabla$  or  $\triangleleft$  to select a folder, press OK to open the folder and select the files. Highlight the one you want to play or watch or press directly ▶ ■ to start playing directly. Press ■ to stop playing and return to upper lever folder. Continuously press RETURN to go back to upper level folder. Repeat again to select and play another media type.

NOTE: By choosing one of the three media types, for example *Movie*, the folders

inside will display only video files and no other formats.

### 6.2.1 Play movies

During playback, press INFO or OK to display/exit the menu bar (Fig. 6). Press ◀ ▶ on the remote control to do relevant operations and start function with OK.

Play & Pause/Stop/Prev./Next

Press ► II to play or pause the playback. Press ■ to stop playing. Press ₩ Ы to play the previous or the next video file. Press INFO and use ▼ ► to highlight the corresponding icon on the control bar, then press **OK**. The TV will response accordingly.

Fast Reverse/Fast Forward Press and hold **♦ >** for seconds to draw the playing progress as your desire, then press II to start the playing from the new position..

Information

Highlight the corresponding icon and press **OK** to view the information of the

playing video.

Capture Highlight the button and press **OK** to capture a screen shot to USB device.

## 6.2.2 Play music

Press INFO or OK to display/exit from the menu bar (Fig. 7). Press ◀ ▶ on the remote control to do relevant operations and start function with OK.

Play & Pause/Stop/Previous/Next

Press ► II to play or pause the playback. Press ■ to stop playing. Press ₩ b) to play the previous or the next music file. Press ► to highlight the corresponding icon on the control bar, and then press **OK**. The TV will response accordingly.

Fast Forward/Fast Reverse

Press and hold ◀ ▶ for seconds to draw the playing progress as you wish, then press II on the remote control to start playing from the new position.

Repeat

Highlight the icon and press OK. You can select 3 different modes: None to disable the function, 1 to repeat one track only and All to repeat the entire list

once it is finished.

Information

Highlight the icon and press **OK** to check the information of the playing

music.

- If one (or more) file(s) of the play list is selected, the buttons ₩ will play only selected files.
- This menu only shows supported files.
- Files with other file extensions are not displayed, even if they are saved on the same USB storage device.
- An over-modulated mp3 file may cause some sound distortion during playback.
- This TV supports lyrics display (in English). The maximum number of characters per line is 48.
- The file name of music and lyrics must be the same in order to display lyrics while the music is playing.
- If you want to show the associated lyrics on the screen with the music, you must store these in the same folder using the same file name with "Irc" file extensions.

Highlight the icon in the menu bar and press **OK** to rotate the picture 90

degrees clockwise or counter clockwise.

Info Highlight the button and press **OK** to check the information of the shown

photo.

Zoom In/Zoom Out Highlight the icon on the menu bar and press OK to zoom in or zoom out of

the image.

Move View When the image is magnified, use this function for convenient check.

Highlight this icon, press  $\mathbf{OK}$ , then press  $\mathbf{V} \mathbf{V}$  to move the image.

**NOTE:** The move function  $\uparrow \downarrow$  is only available when the image is enlarged.

### 6.2.4 Software update via USB

From time to time you can check if there is an improved software version available. This can be viewed and downloaded from our website www.strong.tv. Search the model number on our website's service support section. If there is an improved software version you can download the file and copy it to the root of a USB device. Then press  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  button to select *Software Update (USB)* from the *SETUP* menu on your TV. Afterwards plug your USB device into the USB slot and press **OK** to update the respective software. Confirm with *Yes* using  $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$ . When the update is completed, remove the USB stick, disconnect your device from the main power supply and plug in again.



## 7.0 TROUBLESHOOTING

There maybe various reasons for abnormal operation of your TV set. Check your TV set according to the general procedures shown below. Additionally, we strongly recommend reading the detailed troubleshooting of your TV set in the full user manual available on our website www.strong.tv. If your TV set does not work properly after checking the general and detailed troubleshooting, please contact your dealer, the local Service Hotline, or send an email to our support via www.strong.tv. DO NOT try to open or disassemble your TV set. It may cause a dangerous situation and the warranty will be void.
